

Light Pass Primary School Dress Code

At Light Pass Primary School, all students adhere to the dress code at school, during school excursions and when representing the school in the community.

The wearing of the school dress code:

- Promotes a sense of belonging and pride in the school
- Promotes appropriate clothing for all school activities
- Enables teachers to readily identify students during school excursions
- Reduces peer group pressure
- Enhances our public image

The colours of our dress code are bottle green, yellow and black. The dress code consists of:

- Green and white checked dress with collar and sleeve cuffs
- School polo t-shirts, windcheaters or jackets
- Bottle green polo t-shirts (short and long sleeved)
- Bottle green, black or grey bottoms

There is to be no visible motifs or logos, other than the school logo, on items of clothing under the Dress Code.

Only footwear that provides adequate support must be worn such as school shoes and sneakers. Thongs, strappy or backless sandals are not acceptable.

Hats must provide shade for the face, ears and back of the neck. Only the approved school hat is to be worn. The wearing of hats is compulsory at playtimes and fitness/PE lessons from mid-August until the end of April, as per our SunSmart policy.

The wearing of jewellery at school is not encouraged because of the hazard of the jewellery being caught in equipment and during play. A watch, Medic alert bracelet, sleepers and studs are permitted.

Uniforms can be purchased from our front office.

Strategies to encourage the wearing of our School Uniform

The school will:

- advise and remind parents/caregivers and students that the wearing of school uniform is expected for all school activities, including special events such as excursions and class photo day
- expect parents/carers to actively support and promote the school's Dress Code by providing clothing for their children in Dress Code colours and appropriate styles
- send reminders in the form of notes and letters home promoting the Dress Code and its availability to regular non wearers of school uniform
- make telephone contact with parents/carers where there is continual non-compliance.

The Dress Code of the school is regularly reviewed and ratified by the Governing Council, as representatives of the whole school group.
