We have also enjoyed a very special visitor named Wilbur – he has been such a source of joy for the students and adults alike!



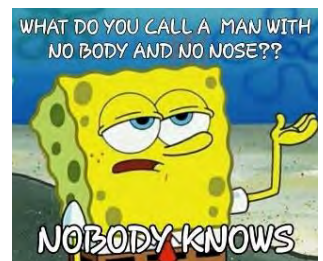
